

## PE&SSPF- Report for Governors- 17.11.16

### ➤ **National Curriculum & Extra Curriculum 2016/17-**

The National Curriculum programme delivered by DCCT continues to provide a quality programme differentiated to meet the needs of the children

The “Plus Sport Move and Learn”- which involves 50% classroom and 50 % practical work and uses the core sports of Handball, Softball, Football, and delivered on Friday afternoons and is providing cross curricular activities including Science, PHSE and PE. DCCT

During the PE session the children evaluate their work and set targets for the next lesson.

The Head teacher has met with a facilitator delivering work as part of the “Healthy Schools Community Award- Dawn Monk TB and MT have completed the audit in readiness to formulate an action plan to be implemented and targets completed by the end of the academic year 2017. This will have a direct correlation with the PE curriculum and cross curricular links in other areas. There is no cost to the PE&SSP Funding as we are a pilot and free.

The Outdoor Activity element of the National Curriculum was met during the visit to Whitehall in October by Year 6 pupils and the whole school during their visit to Lea Green. After School Club is delivered by DCCT every Tuesday afternoon 3.30-4.30 and attended by all children. Tai-Chi was delivered in the curriculum followed by an after school club on Thursdays for a six week block, this will recommence for a further six week block 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2017. Links are again cross curricular and promotes the development of core muscles.

Using PE&SSP Funding we will be in Partnership with Fitzherbert School in a Cricket Project- this will start in March for 6 weeks. Full details are available in the PE folder

**Inclusion-** the work the school and DCCT has done with Martin Mansell- ensures that a fully inclusive programme is in place. Martin has expressed his support for the work that DCCT are doing.

### ➤ **Links with Clubs and Cluster Competitions/festivals-**

It has been highlighted by QEGS staff and leaders that the quality of skill level the children demonstrate when participating against much larger schools is good.

The 2016/17 results /celebration Sainsbury display board reflects their achievements for the first half term- September- October. The QEGS Cluster Primary Competition Calendar has been received and with Biggin Primary School we will participate as BIGGHARTS to ensure access. All results are recorded in the Parish Magazine and are to be included on the School Website. The support of parents with transport is very much appreciated.

The children continue to benefit through HYPAC in accessing a range of sports and clubs.

### ➤ **Rural Derbyshire School Sports Programme RDSSP-** We have received the newsletter, and confirmation of the payment processes. We have applied to be part of a very exciting new initiative- “Covey Pilot- a support project for small schools I will attend a meeting in the new year and report back to Governors

### ➤ **Sainsbury Sports Mark-** the application, has been completed and submitted. We have received confirmation that we have been awarded Bronze.
