

### Maths

Counting, sequencing and place value  
Addition, subtraction, doubling and halving, number bonds  
Multiplication and division  
Two & three dimensional shape and symmetry and fractions of shapes  
Data handling and making charts and graphs  
Time – seasons, birthdays, weather diary  
Weight and length

### Music

Learning traditional and Harvest / Christmas songs and nursery rhymes.  
Reading music and learning how to play the hand bells – leading to a performance

### MFLG

Colours, looking all around us, Food, what do I like to eat? What do I like to play?

### Science / Topic

Seasonal changes – weather – what do I wear? What are the changes? How does it affect me and what I do? Investigating plants and trees, parts of each, their effect on the environment, what do plants need?  
Famous people – Florence Nightingale, and Mary Seacole. The 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ending of World War 1 – How seaside places have changed over the years  
Investigating the local environment through geographical enquiry including occupations and comparing localities i.e. what are the similarities and differences between the two locations.

### Literacy

Harvest / Christmas Prayers – poetry -acrostic, riddles, rhymes, Haiku, weather and recipes.  
Hot Seating Father Christmas Information Texts / non-fiction reports. Recounts of familiar events – summer holidays.  
Traditional stories / Play scripts / Fairy stories– Goldilocks and the three Bears, Jack and the Beanstalk, The Little Red Hen.  
Labelling pictures and making timetables, invitations and menus.  
Rules and notices – the importance of following rules and who helps us in schools (Character profiles) Spelling, grammar, punctuation and phonics.

### Art / DT
