

















Take turns to guess until the number is guessed.

Try larger numbers, decimal numbers or even fractions.

It may help to write the range of numbers down as the game progresses on a number line.



Everyone can join in with this game:

Sit in a circle and count round from 1. Choose the word 'fizz' for multiples of a number such as 3 and 'buzz for multiples of another number such as four.

Eg one, two, fizz, buzz, five, fizz, seven, Buzz, fizz, ten, eleven, fizzbuzz...

Try other multiples or change the words or add another multiple and use the word 'woof.'

























Each player writes down the numbers 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 in a line spaced clearly.

Decide who is to begin - roll a die and the lowest goes first.

The first player rolls the two die, then crosses off both numbers and a number they can make by adding, subtracting, multiplying or dividing the two numbers rolled.

For example:

Rolling a 3 and a 4 would mean crossing off 3 and 4 and either 1 (4-3) or 7(4+3) or $12(4\times3)$

The aim is for the first person to cross off all their numbers.
