Covid-19 & Home Learning

Since the outbreak of Coronavirus and the imposed lock-down. School has only been open for children who are considered vulnerable or those of key workers. It has been a strange time for parents and families who have been forced to stay at home, but one which will be talked about for many years to come. Through the Home Learning tab on the school webs site, staff have continually uploaded teaching activities, web links, challenges, games and projects to help keep your child active and learning during this world pandemic.

The Youth Sports Trust (YST) have produced a 4 minute video reflecting the activities undertaken in November and the views of the active buddies (Class 2), Silver Sports (senior members of the community) and Head Teacher Mrs Blackwell. It is available on the school website and has been circulated to parents and governors.



A showing of the video was held at the January Rural Social Group (RSG) session, which many of the Silver Sports attend. It was received to great acclaim and re-enforced the desire of the Silver Sports to access a Curling Club Session in the near future. Mrs Blackwell with Mrs Broomhead will consider possible dates for this to happen after school 3.30 - 4.30pm, parents will be informed once a programme has been agreed

The video was also shown at Community Lunch on February 14th. It was much appreciated, especially by Class 1 as many of them had not seen it. The content showed a lovely example of how Class 2 children act as role models which in turn is having a positive impact on the younger children, by them emulating their older peers within class 1 with each other.

Activity Cards have been professionally produced by the YST, based on the work done by the children during their IT lessons with Mrs Flower. An impact document, prepared by the YST using surveys and interviews with our children, will be circulated and used to launch an Intergenerational week- March 23rd.

Governors are currently renewing their training on GDPR to ensure that all the personal information which we hold about our pupils and their families are protected to the high standard required.

Security fencing has now been completed in the small playground to ensure we maintain a safe environment for our pupils.



As a Foundation Governor of the school I was delighted to be invited to the Community Lunch held on Valentine's Day.

It was an enjoyable occasion for a number of reasons. The Collective Worship team were delivering their first solo worship to an audience other than the pupils and staff. Their enthusiasm and excitement was reflected in the way in which they sang, delivered prayers and said the Grace which was well received by a congregation of parents, relatives, governors and community members. This was followed by a traditional

seasonal lunch prepared by Mrs Stubbs.

I have spoken to the Collective Worship team and expressed my enjoyment of the day's worship and am looking forward to their next service.

Sadly, due to the weather and time constraints we have not planted our spring bulbs this year. We will be making amends for this lack of activity over the next few months with several projects.


At the January Governor meeting we were able to approve the planned outdoor project of building a vegetable plot and a reflection area with seating, which the whole school will be able to access.

There is an allocation of money ring fenced for the project but unfortunately the cost of the seating area took the project over budget. However it was agreed by the governors, that this was an essential aspect of the project and support from Hartington Community Group (HCG) would be sought to meet the shortfall of £500. We are delighted to say that at the AGM and meeting of the HCG they agreed to fund from the Village trail part of the accounts - the full amount. (Many of you will remember that the Village trail was a partnership project be-

tween the school and the Peak District National Park Authority (PDNPA). They have agreed that the donations collected can be used towards community projects).

The Gardening Club will also be involved in various community projects during the summer involving the Silver Sports and a Garden area at the YHA-Hartington Hall.







The Positive play initiative is also being reintroduced which supports a multi-sensory approach to learning.
