These groups may include:  • Teaching staff, rotary staff, supply staff, site staff, fixed teams, classmates, and others that provide additional in-school supports.  • Pupils on the same bus route, the assigned driver and bus monitors.  • Pupils attending before and after school programs	11/2020
Page 18	For information - Minimum school temperatures were previously set out in the Education (School Premises) Regulations 1999, which for a normal level of physical activity associated with teaching, the appropriate minimum temperature was 18°C. These regulations were replaced on 31 October 2012 by the School Premises (England) Regulations 2012. These regulations do not specify minimum temperatures for any parts of a school.  The Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1992, which apply to all workplaces, including schools, set out requirements on minimum temperatures in workplaces. Regulation 7 requires that temperatures shall be "reasonable" and the temperature in a workplace should normally be at least 16°C. If work involves rigorous physical effort, the temperature should be at least 13°C. However, these temperatures may not necessarily provide reasonable comfort, depending on other factors such as air movement, relative humidity and worker clothing. These temperature guidelines do not apply where it would be impractical to maintain those temperatures, for example in rooms which have to be open to the outside, or where	11/2020

Page 28	Additional wording has been added in the green column, which reads - <b>Note</b> ; in National or local lockdown alert level 'high' (tier 2) or 'very high' (tier 3) Derbyshire County Council Catering Service School Based Staff will wear face coverings in corridors and communal areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain unless the individual is exempt under Government guidance - <u>Face coverings: when to wear one, exemptions, and how to make your own</u> .	11/2020

Page 31	Wording 'Music for Key Stages 4 and 5' has been removed, as control measures apply to all who can achieve appropriate mitigation measures. Removal of wording in green column that is no longer relevant.

In situations where social distancing between adults in settings is not possible (e.g. when moving around in corridors and communal areas), settings have the discretion to recommend the use of face coverings for adults on site, for both staff and visitors.	11/2020

Page 38	Change of wording in green column (second bullet point) to now say - <i>Note; Outside</i> of where national/local restrictions (lockdown) apply, schools have the discretion to recommend the use of face coverings for staff, visitors and pupils in Y7 and above within indoor communal areas where social distancing cannot be safely managed.	11/2020
Page 39	The first 2 rows have been rewritten to add clarity and now reads: <b>Row 1</b> - Where it is not possible, or it is impractical to group children in the same bubbles as they are in during the school day. Children are grouped with the same children each time wherever possible (in groups of 15 children max) and at least one staff member, depending on the type of provision or size of the group. <b>Row 2</b> - The school follows Government guidance for out of school provision.
