PESSP governor report- December 2020 (to be added to website after meeting)

The Impact Document 2019/20 which was completed in July 2020 and placed on the school website, reflected an underspend of £2000 which needs to be spent by March 31<sup>st</sup> 2021. In discussion with the School Business Officer (SBO) we are confident that this will be spent appropriately by the deadline to support the physical literacy and development of our children. In November we received the first payment £9333.00 for SSPF, of this we have already spent funds on affiliation to Rural Derbyshire School Sport Partnership (RDSSP), CPD training for 3 staff and First Aid Training – REAL PE, resources and equipment.

The staff have provided a comprehensive programme of activities during curriculum as well as across the other curriculum areas which is supporting a minimum of 30 minutes of physical activity for each child. Due to Covid-19 regulations I am unable to be involved directly with this work but I am confident that the quality and range of fundamental skills and personal physical development is consistently delivered and access to the virtual challenges provided by RDSSP are being utilised to best effect. The positive impact of the new equipment has been seen both during Curriculum and Playtimes.

The wrap around care was unable to run during the summer term due to Covid-19 restrictions. Following the lifting of some of the restrictions, parents were canvased at the beginning of the school term and there was no take up for the breakfast or after school's clubs. They were canvassed again at the end of autumn term 1 and there was no take up for the breakfast club but there was for the after school club. Therefore, this recommenced at the beginning of autumn term 2 and is run on Tuesdays from 3:30 to 4:30 by LJ. The content of the club ranges from sport, games, creative tasks and hopefully in the future baking.

HYPAC- contact was made with parents in September and again at the end of October. All letters and information are on file with the school.

It is hoped that HYPAC, with a changed format, will resume in late January only using the Village hall at this time rather than compromise the safety of the school. Meetings have been held with the leaders as well as communications directly with the Youth Sports Trust (YST) The AGM, to be held in the village hall or via zoom, will be held in early January.
