Intent

At Hartington C of E Primary School Primary School, our RE curriculum follows the Derbyshire Agreed Syllabus document and this is further supported by 'Understanding Christianity.' It contains relevant and inspirational information and ensures that key theological concepts and vocabulary are reinforced in meaningful contexts.

This is achieved through first-hand experiences and structured delivery ensuring layered understanding and achievable outcomes. Concepts are deliberately constructed so our children's religious knowledge is built upon through a rolling three-year programme.

This allows the children to develop their understanding of not only their personal beliefs and culture, but those wider beliefs held by other faiths within the diverse cultures living around our world, whilst acknowledging the expanding diversity within our present society.

Implementation

The teaching of RE seeks both to impart knowledge and develop understanding of religious experiences, feelings and attitudes through a variety of teaching and learning approaches. RE teaching draws on a wide range of key strategies for learning, including:

- Open questioning
- Thinking skills
- Literacy for RE
- Discussion
- Expressive arts and creativity for learning
- Visits and visitors
- Practical approaches
- Rigorous assessment and planning

The teaching of RE will involve some direct teaching and whole class, group, paired or individual activities. A range of teaching styles will be used including enquiry, exploration, discussion, role play, drama, asking and answering questions, using a range of sources including ICT, works of art, artefacts, visits and visitors. Across all the subjects taught within the curriculum, we strive for 'Quality first teaching' to take place. Differentiation is used appropriately to ensure that children of all abilities, including less able, those with additional needs or those with gifts or talents make progress and enjoy the subject of RE, becoming animated reflective learners.

As a Church of England School, within the RE syllabus there is a specific focus on Christianity which can be evidenced in our daily Collective Worship and our RE lessons.

Impact

We will know our RE curriculum has been effective, as children at Hartington C of E Primary School will be able to:

- Ask and offer possible answers to challenging questions within units being taught.
- Have a secure understanding and knowledge of the religions studied.
- Have the ability to ask significant and reflective questions about religion.
- Have a sense of self, identity and belonging to flourish within the community and be responsible citizens.
- Show respect, tolerance and understanding of all religions and beliefs.
- Have a strong understanding of how the beliefs, values, practices and ways of life within any religion come together.
- Have the ability to link the study of religion and belief to personal reflections on meaning and purpose.
- Have the ability to exemplify the School's Christian Values in all aspects of life that are rooted in the teachings of the Bible.
