Pupil Premium Strategy Statement

Each year the school carefully plans the Pupil Premium expenditure to ensure the children who are in receipt of it receive the optimum impact to their learning.

We carefully plan the needs of each individual child to ensure that their progress, attainment and social experience at our school is of a high value, which requires considering each child's personal learning pathway to maximise best value and most impact.

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding in publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

In the last financial year schools received £1320 for pupils in reception year to year six. This funding was allocated to each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point during the last six years.

Ofsted are required to look at how funding has been used in schools and how effective this has been. It is the schools leaders and governing body's responsibility to ensure the premium is effectively used and is targeted at the identified children. At Hartington C of E Primary school we endeavour to assess the impact of this funding at regular intervals and the planning is adjusted when and where necessary.

In 2014/2015 the school received £2646.00

In 2015/2016 the school received £7215.64

In 2016/2017 the school will receive £9080.00 (£4540 already received. Next instalments due around 14-1-17 & 31-3-17)

As a school we have a number of strategies and options available to us to show how this money is spent and its impact.

This may include:

- Early intervention strategies
- Funding extra TA/teacher hours
- One to One tutoring
- Small group work
- IT support (Keyboard skills)
