Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2020

Each year the school carefully plans the Pupil Premium expenditure to ensure the children who are in receipt of it receive the optimum impact to their learning. We carefully plan the needs of each individual child to ensure that their progress, attainment and social experience at our school is of a high value. This requires considering each individual child’s learning pathway to ensure their mental health and wellbeing, whilst maximising impact and best value.

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding in publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. In the last financial year schools received £1320 per child for pupils in EYFS to those in year six.

This funding is allocated to each pupil registered as eligible for free school meals at any point during the present and previous six years in total. Ofsted are required to look at how funding is being used in schools and the impact it has made on these pupils. It is the school’s leadership team including the Governing body’s responsibility, to ensure the Pupil Premium allocation of money is effectively used for the eligible pupils.

At Hartington C of E Primary School we assess the impact of this funding at designated intervals. Through careful monitoring of the individual programmes adjustments are made to the programmes when and where necessary to promote progress, attainment and best value.

In 2016/2017 the school received and spent £9080

In 2017/2018 the school received and spent £5741

In 2018/2019 the school received and spent £7135

In 2019/2020 the school will receive £6260

As a school we have a number of strategies and options available to us to show how this money is spent and its impact. This may include: • Early intervention strategies • funding extra TA/teacher hours • One to One tutoring • Small group work • IT support (Keyboard skills) • Nurture Programmes • Curriculum Specialism Teacher Support • Enrichment opportunities through external and on-site visits.
