Monday		Generosity of the world around us		A chance to use our voices and lift our spirits through the power of song.
Tuesday		Generosity of the world around us		<p>Have you ever stopped to think about how generous the world around us is? Christians believe this is a sign of God’s generosity! Fruit, flowers, water, sunlight, crops, fish, birds and animals, weather.</p> <p>Think of blossom, which comes in huge abundance and the tree looks absolutely beautiful for a few days, and then all the blossom falls and the moment is over. It seems like such an extravagant gesture to provide so many flowers which are so beautiful for such a fleeting moment.</p> <p>Share Twinkl powerpoint – Christian creation story</p> <p>Creation is a gift which we need to care for and nurture so that everyone can enjoy it, not something we exploit for our own gain. Sharing the good gifts of nature and taking care of it seem to be part of this concept too – even something simple like not picking wild flowers so that everyone can enjoy them rather than being selfish and taking them home for yourself.</p>
